Late Bus

Sliding Scale Fees

In order to help sustain this valuable program, trimester fees are charged for the after school clubs. It is also required that we provide a sliding scale fee system for our families.

- Fees are based on the free/reduced school lunch program and charged per club for the entire trimester.
- Fees will not be adjusted in the event of an absence or cancellation.
