<u>Late Bus</u>

> Select the site where your child will be dropped off and enter it on the enrollment form.

 \succ Arrive 10 minutes before the scheduled time and approach the bus to meet the student(s).

Identification is required.

> For a child to be dropped off, a parent or other designee must be waiting at the stop.

> Contact the school and send a note if there are any changes in dismissal plans.

➤ The North Bus will arrive at stops 15 minutes early on Fridays.

Sliding Scale Fees

In order to help sustain this valuable program, trimester fees are charged for the afterschool clubs. It is also required that we provide a sliding scale fee system for our families.

- Fees are based on the free/reduced school lunch program and are charged <u>per club</u> for the entire trimester.
 - Fees will not be adjusted in the event of an absence or cancellation.
